**Diversifying water portfolios essential in planning for sustainable water supplies**

Conservation is a cornerstone of both the City of Santa Cruz and Soquel Creek Water District's water planning programs. Local water users have considerably reduced consumption through the various conservation programs offered by both of our agencies. However, while we will continue to maximize our conservation programs, we cannot achieve the goal of a sustainable water supply relying solely on conservation.

Numerous studies have consistently confirmed that we must also diversify our water portfolios by developing a new source of supply. A thorough examination of the factors that must be considered for developing a new municipal water supply has led our two agencies to the evaluation of desalination as the most feasible option to provide water during drought conditions, to limit groundwater pumping, and prevent seawater intrusion. In conjunction with conservation and curtailment, desalination would help supplement existing water supplies. For more information, [click here](#).
